

## One-pager on existing feasible solutions Concept Note (short version)

**Executive Summary.** The problems will never be solved not until they are addressed with existing feasible solutions. We will apply this One-pager innovative approach in Haiti. We launch a call for writing these One-pager on the cross-cutting and sectoral topics to all Haitian professionals and the Haiti friends specialists, based in Haiti or abroad, that have the academic training and the concrete professional experience in a topic and want to bring their contribution to the improvement of the collective well-being in Haiti. They can also share that concept note with their fellow professionals interested in this initiative.

We will answer the 5 key questions : What is a One-pager?, How could it be useful?, How to contribute to it ? Who can contribute to it?, On which topics it could focus?, before launching the call to write the One-pager.

1. A One-pager is a document of one page that describes a specific topic. The launch of One-pager is the first step to solve Haiti's problems. These One-pager will focus on crucial problems in Haiti and their related win-win solution that will generate an inclusive, multiplying, and catalyzing effect.
2. We all know that for a country to develop, we need to: coordinate, apply, monitor and evaluate all existing feasible solutions. That is why the One-pager documents are highly important, as they are the starting point for a general awakening of awareness, leading to the application of solutions.
3. Starting a One-pager involves identifying a well-documented fundamental problem, the solution already implemented elsewhere with results, and research providing solution leads. This part of the One-pager is quite automatic and intuitive for thematic specialists. However, the part of the One-pager enriching existing solutions with implementation programs or projects through institutions is less obvious.
4. There is a core of competent professionals with the appropriate academic qualifications and professional experience, both in Haiti and abroad. It is their task to synthesize feasible and adaptable existing solutions in Haiti, their applications, monitoring and evaluations. Google, World Bank, IDB, etc., have a rich digital library. *Everything is already there. It needs to be resumed and rewritten.*
5. The One-Pagers could focus on the 11 thematic areas related to crucial problems:
  - a. Security and Justice
  - b. Governance (Public Administration and Finances, Transparency and Accountability)
  - c. Impunity, Corruption, and Citizenship
  - d. Agriculture, fishing, poultry, meat and tourism value chains (production, transportation, processing, and marketing) documented for the [81 typical products](#) from the 10 departments, with technical support and solidarity microcredit; Agricultural information systems
  - e. Education (professional and university training) focused on employment, production, and technology
  - f. Sanitation and Waste Management, Health Information Systems
  - g. Watershed and Irrigation Canal Management
  - h. Culture, Recreation, and Entertainment
  - i. International Trade and Foreign Direct Investments
